RUTH MARIE PHILLIPS (NEE LUDWIGSEN)

(March 31, 1928 - April 7, 2022, Fresno)

Ruth was a PCNS Member since 1965, and was the first woman to serve as our President (1971/2). Ruth was the last surviving PCNS Gold Member (50 years membership).

While there are no more PCNS members from during her presidency, many of us knew her from her service to the California State Numismatic Association, first as their President, and later as Librarian, arranging to get the impressive CSNA Library out of storage and back to serving their membership as a true circulating library. CSNA awarded Ruth their highest honor, the Medal of Merit, for her faithful service and extensive work in reviving and cataloging the CSNA Library. For decades Ruth also served in background roles at CSNA conventions in both the North and the South, rarely missing any Association event.



Ruth was mentioned in our June 2022 program as the subject of a December 1972 medal in our Archives marking her betrothal to S. Everett Phillips, who was president of CSNA while Ruth served as PCNS president. She moved to Southern California shortly thereafter, eventually living in Fresno for 47 years, and becoming a member

of the Fresno Numismatic Society and the Visalia Coin Club.

Ruth's last appearance at a PCNS function was as an honored attendee at our Centennial Banquet in 2015.
